



<u>Voice</u>

Soprano **Cindy Townsend** has performed on operatic and concert stages across Canada and in Europe, including performances in Germany, Austria, the Czech Republic and Hungary, singing numerous operatic and musical theatre roles as well as concert work in song and oratorio.

Cindy spent many years based in Toronto as both a performer and as a voice teacher. She has collaborated with icons of our industry, including her mentor, long time teacher and friend, the late Lois Marshall, whom she first met at the Scotia Festival while working on Mendelssohn's *Elijah*. This led to a long relationship that inspired and paved the way for her musical journey including cultivating her love for teaching in a variety of genres. Cindy is extremely proud of the many students she has worked with over the years who have pursued careers in the arts.



Cindy is also the founder of Complex Cares! Kids Helping Kids!, a fundraising initiative which brings professional artists and students from various genres together for an annual event to benefit the Complex Care Clinic, Hospital for Sick Children, Toronto. From this initiative, various concerts and events have been motivated focused on the spirit of giving back to community through music.

While very thankful to continue to enjoy her Toronto studio online, Cindy is thrilled to be back in the Maritimes, uniting with the wonderful team at DalVoice, Dalhousie University in Halifax. Through establishing the foundations of strong vocal technique, artistic style and an all-round skill as a musician, Cindy aims to inspire her students to pursue their vocal goals in whatever genre best suits their personal expression.

<u> Piano</u>

Tong Wang is a Canadian artist across areas of performance, engagement. Her projects explore identity, culture, and current socialchamber musician, Tong has Symphony Orchestra, Red Deer ensembles across North America multidisciplinary artist, she has opera, "Labyrinth of Tears", funded and SSHRC, participated in the Residency in France. and photo-essay in the literary other projects include the creative "Ghiblilane". Tong recently toured a recital on multiculturalism, "我们Us" in Lunenburg, Montreal, Basel, and presented the interactive concerts "We're Not Really Strangers" and "My Neighbours Totoro and Claude!" at the Verbier Festival. In 2022, Tong launched the Windwood Music Festival in Airdrie, Alberta to engage with and support rural farming communities through classical chamber music. In 2023, Tong will be touring with *Duo Perdendosi* across eastern US & Canada, as well as with *Duo Incarnadine* in Turkey and China to premiere a new commission by Alice Ho, *Four Impressions of China*. Using diverse mediums, Tong aims to share the power of art to reach across time, languages, borders, and cultures to connect people and kindle a shared understanding.

<u>Strings</u>



One of CBC's "30 hot Canadian Classical Musicians under 30", **Dorothy Ro** is a member of the acclaimed Verona Quartet. She has performed on international stages that include London's Wigmore Hall, Philharmonie de Paris, Melbourne's Recital Hall, as well as Carnegie Hall and the John F. Kennedy Center for Performing Arts. As a recent recipient of the prestigious Cleveland Quartet Award, Ms. Ro is currently Guest Artist in Residence at Oberlin Conservatory and College.

Dorothy has garnered top prizes at international competitions, including London's Wigmore Hall International String Quartet Competition, the Melbourne and MPrize International Chamber Music Competition, Quatuors à Bordeaux; the Fischoff and Coleman National Chamber Music Competitions, the Eckhardt-Gramatté National Canadian Competition, and the Canadian Kiwanis National Competition. Other awards include a grant recipient from the Sylva Gelber Music Foundation and the Nova Scotia Talent Trust.

<u>Brass</u>

Jack Brownell grew up in Truro, NS, and upon completing his undergraduate degree at Acadia University spent two years playing with Symphony Nova Scotia. Following a residency at the Banff Centre School of Fine Arts, Jack was invited as a scholarship student by Daniel Perantoni to pursue graduate studies at Arizona State University where, as a Dean's List student, he completed his Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts (performance) work with a perfect 4.0 grade point average.



While chamber music is his genre of choice, having long been involved in professional brass quintets in both Germany and the US, he has been found in Canadian, German, and American symphony orchestras and performing with touring Broadway productions.



<u>Woodwind</u>



Charmaine Chaddock, MMM, CD is a Petty Officer 1st Class in The Stadacona Band of The Royal Canadian Navy, Halifax Nova Scotia. She has served in Edmonton's Royal Canadian Artillery Band, Ottawa's Central Band of the Canadian Armed Forces, and Victoria's Naden Band of Maritime Forces Pacific. She holds a MMus from the U of Toronto, a BMus from U of Ottawa, and has studied wind band conducting within the CAF. She has completed Arctic Winter Warfare Training in Resolute Nunavut, represented the CAF at NATO's Partnership for Peace School in Ankara Turkey, served with the Royal New Zealand Navy Band in Auckland and had the honour to perform at Juno Beach, Vimy Ridge, Beaumont Hamel, and various cities in the Netherlands, Belgium, and Germany. Charmaine is the musical director of the Canadian

Military Wives Choir, Halifax. This year Charmaine was awarded The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Medal and has been appointed to the Order of Military Merit. The medal will be presented to her by the Governor General of Canada at Rideau Hall later this year.

The Nova Scotia Kiwanis, and Provincial Music Festivals were integral to Charmaine's education growing up in Halifax. As a flutist she represented Nova Scotia twice at the National Music Festival. The Chaddock Family Quartet, comprised of Charmaine and her three siblings, were named Junior Stars of the Kiwanis Festival, and later Senior Stars of the Festival. She is deeply honoured to be asked to adjudicate this year.

Musical Theatre

Monette Gould is a soprano with many years of professional experience as a performer and teacher. Born in New Brunswick, she later moved to Toronto, Ontario to pursue her studies in music. Monette holds two performance diplomas, an A.R.C.T. and a Performance Licentiate, from The Royal Conservatory of Music, and an Opera Performance Diploma from the University of Toronto.

After completing her studies, Monette returned to New Brunswick to teach voice at Mount Allison University and l'Université de Moncton. She also taught privately and worked with high school students who wanted to prepare to enter university music programs. Monette is the founder and director of the well-known Voce dell'Anima



Choir. She has also taught courses such as Diction for Singers, Sight-singing, Dictation and Aural Skills, and has given workshops on Stage Presence, How to Practice, Options in Music, and How to Set Up a Private Studio. She is highly regarded and is in very high demand as an adjudicator and clinician across the country. Many of her students have excelled, continuing to some of the best international graduate programs, and winning prestigious awards, competitions, and scholarships.

Monette has appeared in several opera productions, and her roles include Fiordiligi in Mozart's *Cosi fan tutte*, the Countess in Mozart's *Le nozze di Figaro*, and Tatiana in Tchaikovsky's *Eugene Onegin* just to name a few. In 1998, she appeared as Mimi in Opera New Brunswick's production of Puccini's *La Bohème*. Monette continues an active career as soloist, performing in concerts and various projects throughout the Maritimes.

The human voice being her passion, Monette is dedicated to continually educating herself in the latest vocal techniques, new developments in vocal health, and diction for singers.

<u>Choral</u>



Kokopelli Choir Association's executive director **Kathleen Luyk**, B.Mus. (University of British Columbia, 2003), M.Mus. Choral Conducting (University of Alberta, 2005), is in her twentieth season with Òran and her tenth season with Vacilando. Kathleen (Katy) is also a proud alumna of Kokopelli. As a conductor, Katy strives to pair a well-researched pedagogy of excellence with the notion that choral singing is an incredible force in building community.

As a conductor and composer on the Alberta choral scene, Katy has been engaged as a clinician, guest conductor, vocal coach, and adjudicator for choirs and singers around Canada. Most recently, Katy appeared as an adjudicator at the Cantando festival in Sun Peaks, Edmonton, and Whistler. Katy is a past president of Choir Alberta and has presented nationally at Choral Canada conferences.

<u>Composer</u>



Described as a "rising star" by MusicWorks magazine, JUNO-Nominated composer **Jared Miller**'s eclectic music is "playful" (New York Times), "hypnotic" (Sequenza 21), "phantasmagorical" (Lucid Culture) and "highly personal" (CBC Radio). He has worked in collaboration with many ensembles both in North America and internationally including the American Composers Orchestra, the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, the Nashville Symphony, the Victoria Symphony, the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony, the National Youth Orchestra of Canada, the symphony orchestra, Cleveland's Contemporary Youth Orchestra, the Sneak Peek Orchestra, the Attacca Quartet, Latitude 49 Ensemble, the New York City

Ballet's Choreographic Institute, the Emily Carr String Quartet, Sonora Collective, Standing Wave Ensemble and a long list of soloists that include pianists Sara Davis Buechner, Jani Parsons, Robert Fleitz and Imri Talgam, and violinist Francisco Fullana. His music has been featured and recognized in the New York Philharmonic's Biennial (2014), the ISCM World Music Days (2017 & 2019), Vancouver's Queer Arts Festival (2010, 2015 & 2019) and the Vancouver and Victoria Symphony's New Music Festivals (2015-2019). After concluding a two-year stint as Assistant Professor of Composition and Theory and Dalhousie University in Halifax, Canada, he currently serves as Assistant Professor of Composition at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts which he began in Fall 2022.

<u>Guitar</u>

Kevin Brunkhorst's first memories of music included seeing the Beatles play 'Hey Jude', which was aired on the Ed Sullivan Show on February 15, 1970. He received his first guitar for Christmas that year. When the local high school band director tested everyone for musical aptitude, he came in second, and was steered toward the clarinet. (The promised switch to the saxophone later on never happened.) From the Beatles, his musical diet expanded: Led Zeppelin, Yes, Pink Floyd, Steely Dan, Genesis, Miles Davis, Weather Report, and Pat Metheny.



He attended the University of North Texas 1983-87 (Bachelor of Music, Composition) and 2001-04 (Master of Music, Jazz Studies). (In between those stints at UNT, he worked in the music industry.) He was a member of their renowned One O'Clock Lab Band (1986, 2002-2004), studied jazz guitar with Jack Petersen and Fred Hamilton, and composition with Martin Mailman, Larry Winsor, and Cindy McTee.

He started at St.FX in 2004, teaching jazz guitar, jazz composition, and music technology. In subsequent years, he also taught courses in music theory, modern jazz history, history of popular music, and the Beatles. He also leads the Guitar Ensemble, in which guitarists learn a very high standard of performance and reading skills.

Trophies and Awards:

The Margaret Durning Trophy and Award for Junior Vocal Solo: The Margaret Durning Trophy has been donated by the New Glasgow Music Festival to honour Marg's years of devoted service to both that Festival and the Federation of Music Festivals of Nova Scotia. The award supporting this trophy is given by members of the Alcorn/Durning Family.

The Maureen Hopkins Memorial Rose Bowl and Award for Junior Piano Solo: Maureen Hopkins served on the Board of the Federation of Music Festivals of Nova Scotia (FMFNS) for many years as a representative of the Bridgewater Music Festival. During her tenure with the Federation, she held the offices of Director, President, and Past President. She was instrumental in the evolution of the FMNS and in the creation of the Provincial Music Festival. She worked tirelessly to grow the various aspects of the festival. It was through her vision that a junior level of competition was developed. Maureen's objective was to encourage young musicians in the province by providing an opportunity for a higher level of competition. It created tremendous interest and added a very worthwhile dimension to the festival.

The Federation, with the assistance of her family, wished to honour Maureen's memory by creating The Maureen Hopkins Memorial Junior Piano Rose Bowl Award. The award supporting this trophy is given by Donald Hopkins.

The Sheila K. Piercey Trophy and Award for Senior Vocal Solo: Sheila K. Piercey, an accomplished soprano, began her training in her birthplace of Halifax. After becoming an established singer in her home province and a scholarship winner she moved to Toronto to continue her voice studies at the Royal Conservatory of Music and University of Toronto Opera School. She appeared with the Royal Conservatory Opera and CBC Opera before joining the Canadian Opera Company in 1957. Her natural vivacity and clear, flexible, rich voice led her to 22 COC roles and 16 COC tours. Upon her retirement from the COC in 1971 she returned to Halifax as an avid supporter of the performing arts in Nova Scotia. She was always especially passionate about helping young talent to realize their full potential. This award is supported by Brenda Ploeg, given in loving memory of her aunt, Sheila K. Piercey.

The Jackson Rose Bowl for Senior Piano Solo and Award: The Jackson Rose Bowl was donated by the Annapolis Valley Music Festival in honour of Festival co-founders Hetty Jackson and Marlene Jackson. The Award accompanying this trophy is given by Patricia Bryson.

Patricia Bryson (B.A. B. Ed. ARCT) is a member of the NS Registered Music Teachers' Association and and is presently serving on the boards of the NS (Halifax) Kiwanis Music Festival, NS Provincial Music Festival, Scotia Festival of Music and is President of the Canadian Music Competition for NS.

The Robert (Bob) Murray Memorial Award for Senior Strings: This is a new award, given by Kathleen Fuller in memory of long time FMFNS Board member and Treasurer, Bob Murray. Bob was born and began his musical career as a violinist in New Glasgow and was a competitor in the first NGMF. He and his wife, Mavis, lived most of their working lives in Antigonish where Bob made a major contribution to the cultural life of the town and county. He was a Life Member of the Federation of Canadian Music Festivals.

The Russell Alcorn Memorial Awards for Musical Theatre: These awards are given in memory of the Rev. Russell Alcorn who was a well-known pianist, organist, and soloist throughout the Maritime Provinces. Throughout the years he was involved as an actor in many productions of Theatre Antigonish which included several major roles in Musical Theatre.

Nova Scotia Choral Federation Rose Bowl Trophy: The Nova Scotia Choral Federation Rose Bowl has been generously donated by the Nova Scotia Choral Federation. It goes to a winning choral group of thirteen or more singers aged 19 years and under. In support of the trophy, the Nova Scotia Choral Federation donates two camp scholarships to enable young choristers in Nova Scotia to attend one of their annual Summer Children's and Youth Choir Camps
